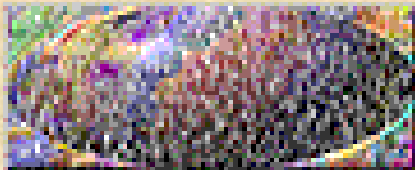

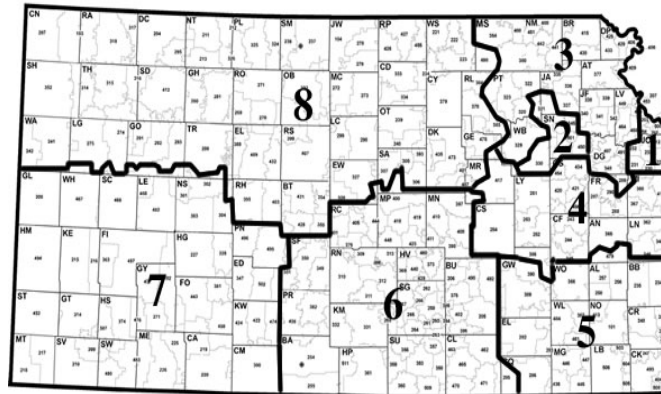

KASEA Q & A

What is KASEA's organizational structure?

KASEA is governed by an Executive Board with elected officers of president, president-elect, secretary and treasurer. The Executive Board includes KASEA elected officers, immediate past president, 8 region representatives, and committee chairpersons required to implement the strategic plan.

What are KASEA Regions?

The Kansas Association of Special Education Administrators is comprised of members from eight geographical regions of the state. Each region elects a regional representative who serves on the executive board and coordinates regional meetings and communication with all active and non-active members in the region.

Who can join KASEA?

Public School Personnel - special education directors, assistant directors, coordinators or others assigned direct responsibilities for the administration of special education programs.

KSDE - Student Support Services Team

State, Community, and Private Institutions Serving Exceptional Children - The chief administrator of the education program or a designated representative.

University/College Trainers - Those having direct responsibility for the training of special education administrators and other

persons preparing to serve exceptional children.

Students (nonvoting) - Those having a direct relationship in training or education that relates to special education administration

Retired Administrators (nonvoting) - Those who had the responsibility of special education administration.

How do I join?

Go to www.ka-sea.org, click on new membership registration and fill out information. OR you may pay your membership dues at the time you join or renew your membership to United School Administrators. KASEA membership is from July 1 - June 30 renewable each year. Dues are \$25 for voting members and \$10 for nonvoting members.

How do I get involved?
